Correct analysis of the religious phenomenon, in the light of research on the history and philosophy of religions; PS6. Promoting interreligious and multicultural dialogue; PS7. Formulation of the current field of knowledge, paradigms and current methodological guidelines in the field of biblical theology in order to function as a specialist on issues of Christian morality at individual and community level; PS8. The nuanced and relevant use of contextualization strategies, as well as the evaluation methodologies needed to formulate value judgments and substantiate constructive decisions.

At the end of this course the student must be able to: - To provide a theoretical and theological foundation for understanding and evaluating the complex relationship between the Gospel and culture; - To articulate and illustrate the central aspects that culture brings to Christians; - To equip students with those conceptual tools necessary to analyze cultural dynamics.
7.2 Specific objectives	Students will be able to perceive the Gospel as public truth and they will understand the contribution of this concept to the development of a public theology. They will know how to create an innovative Christian perspective in terms of challenging and culture formation.
